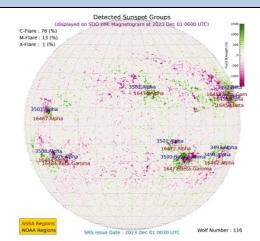

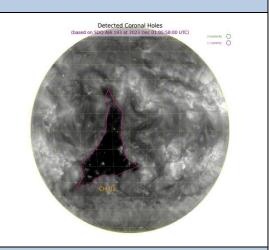
Solar conditions are at moderate levels with background X-ray flux at C-class levels.

There is one active region AR3500 present on the Sun capable of producing strong M and X-class solar flares having chances of 13% and 1% respectively.

01 Coronal Hole (CH) is detected on the solar disk.





2-Day Conditions

Solar activity is expected to be at low to moderate levels.

In case of M/X-class solar flares, minor to moderate radio blackouts may be observed.

Low to moderate solar windspeed and quiet to unsettled geomagnetic activity is expected over the weekend.

Normal to slightly depressed ionospheric conditions are expected for the next 2 days. It is advised to use the frequency ranges mentioned in the ionospheric section.
