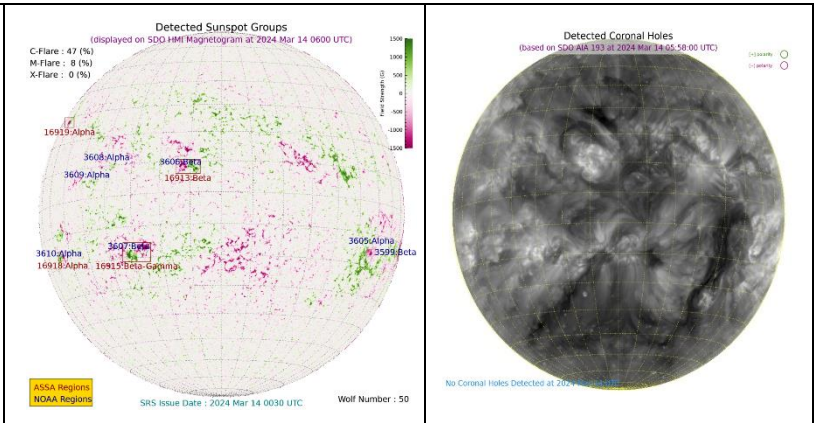

DISCUSSION:

Solar activity is expected to be at low to moderate levels. In case of solar flares, shortwave fadeouts may be observed. Low to moderate solar wind speed and quiet geomagnetic activity is expected. HF conditions are normal.
